SUMMARY OF WASHINGTON LAW

Employees who do not have 2 free hours (excluding meals and breaks) during their work day in which polls are open, and who receive their work schedule with insufficient time to request an absentee ballot, are entitled to up to 2 paid hours leave to vote.
The employer can set the time for leave to vote.
